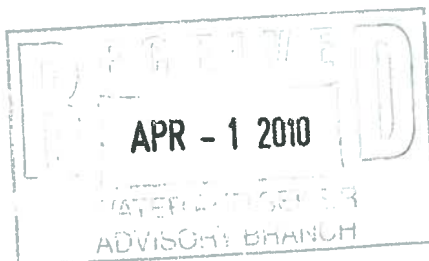

Golden State Water Company ("GSWC") hereby transmits for filing an original and two conformed copies of this advice letter applicable to its Orange County District, which consists of the Los Alamitos and Placentia Customer Service Areas.

Subject *Schedule 14.1-OC Rationing Stage*

Purpose

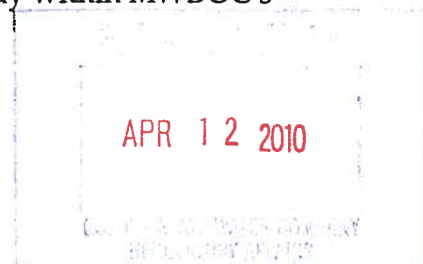
In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 3, Division 1, of the Water Code of the State of California and the California Public Utilities Commission's ("Commission") Standard Practice U-40, GSWC is seeking authority to lower the stage of Mandatory Water Conservation and Rationing, as established in its Schedule No. 14.1-OC, Mandatory Water Conservation and Rationing. GSWC requests that this advice letter become effective upon its filing date and remain in effect until modified or terminated by GSWC or the Commission.

Background

On July 9, 2009, GSWC filed Advice Letter 1339-W, requesting to implement a Stage 2 rationing plan in the Orange County District. This request was based on the need to reduce water supply demand to meet Municipal Water District of Orange County's ("MWDOC") reduction in water allocation to GSWC, which went into effect on July 1, 2009.

As required by Section 351 of the California Water Code, public meetings were held in each of the Orange County District customer service areas. Implementation of Schedule No. 14.1-OC began on August 1, 2009. Premium charges for customers that exceeded their monthly allocation began on September 1, 2009.

Due to customer response to GSWC's conservation request, GSWC has been successful in reducing its projected water supply demand by 14%, which is above the amounts requested in Advice Letter 1339-W. Based on current and estimated future demand reductions, GSWC has determined that it can lower the rationing level to Stage 1, a voluntary reduction. At Stage 1, customers will still be asked to conserve so that GSWC can continue to stay within MWDOC's allocation, however, premium penalties will be discontinued.



A copy of GSWC's Base Year Demand Analysis is attached, which shows a revised base year average customer demand.

Request

GSWC is requesting to deactivate the Stage 2 rationing plan in its Orange County District customer service areas and activate a Stage 1 rationing plan, with voluntary conservation.

GSWC will discontinue the collection of premium charges as of April 5, 2010. This date will complete the latest meter reading cycle.

Customer Noticing

GSWC will notify all of its customers in its Orange County District's customer service areas by mail of the implementation of the Stage 1, voluntary rationing plan. A copy of the customer notice is attached to this advice letter.

Tier Designation

Pursuant to D. 07-01-024, this advice letter is submitted with a Tier 1 designation.

Protest And Responses

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:


If you have not received a reply to your protest within 10 business days, contact this person at 909-394-3600 ext. 682.

The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

**Golden State Water Company Seeks to Change Orange County
Water Rationing from Mandatory to Voluntary**

Dear Valued Customer,

This letter is an update to Golden State Water Company's (GSWC) water rationing plan for customers in the Orange County District that went into effect August 1, 2009. The plan, Schedule 14.1-OC, Mandatory Water Conservation and Rationing, was approved by the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), and a copy is available at our Los Alamitos Customer Service Area office, 10852 South Cherry St.; our Placentia Customer Service Area office, 500 Cameron St.; or online at www.gswater.com.

GSWC customers have been successful reducing the overall water supply demand in Orange County since August 1, 2009. The level of conservation is above the 6 percent reduction called for in the rationing plan. Thank you for any steps you took to become more water efficient to help us meet this goal.

Based on current and estimated future demand, GSWC has asked the CPUC in an advice letter for approval to lower the rationing stage from a mandatory reduction to a voluntary reduction. This is not a call to stop your successful conservation efforts since we will soon be heading into the summer months when customers have historically used the most water. If conservation efforts are not maintained, GSWC may again be required to implement mandatory rationing at a future date.

If our advice letter is approved, customers would see the change in the following billing statement. Customers would continue to receive water allocations based on a 6 percent reduction from historical average usage for the property. However, if customers exceed the allocation, no premium penalties will be assessed. Customers will still be encouraged to meet their conservation goals and a list of water-use restrictions will remain in effect. A list of those restrictions is enclosed.

Tiered rates that went into effect in November 2008 also will remain. Tiered rates encourage residential customers to save water by giving them financial incentive to use less. In Orange County, customers will pay the lowest rate for each Ccf (hundred cubic feet or 748 gallons) they use in tier one, up to 16 Ccf per month. For every unit of water used in tier two, which is 17 Ccf and above, customers will pay a higher rate.

Golden State Water Company Non-Essential Water Use Restrictions

- Use of water through any connection when the utility has notified the customers in writing to repair a broken or defective plumbing, sprinkler, watering or irrigation system and the customer has failed to make such repairs within 5 business days after receipt of such notice.
- Use of water which results in flooding or run-off into gutters, waterways, patios, driveway, or streets.
- Use of water for washing aircraft, cars, buses, boats, trailers, or other vehicles without a positive shut-off nozzle on the outlet end of the hose. Exceptions include washing vehicles at commercial or fleet vehicle washing facilities operated at fixed locations where equipment using water is properly maintained to avoid wasteful use.
- Use of water through a hose for washing buildings, structures, sidewalks, walkways, driveways, patios, parking lots, tennis courts, or other hard-surfaced areas in a manner which results in excessive run-off or waste.
- Use of water for watering streets with trucks, except for initial wash-down for construction purposes (if street sweeping is not feasible), or to protect the health and safety of the public.
- Use of water for construction purposes, such as consolidation of backfill, dust control, or other uses unless no other source of water or other method can be used.
- Use of water for more than minimal landscaping in connection with any new construction.
- Use of water for watering outside plants, lawn, landscape and turf areas. Except that this provision shall not apply to commercial nurseries, golf courses and other water-dependent industries. Below are the water use restrictions at each stage of mandatory conservation and rationing:
 - At Stage 1&2: Water use restricted from 9am – 5pm, except by hand;
 - At Stage 3: Water use restricted from 9am – 5pm, watering every other day – no more than three times per week;
 - At Stage 4: Water use restricted from 9am – 5pm, watering every other day – no more than two times per week;
 - At Stage 5-7: Water use restricted from 9am – 5pm, watering limit to no more than one time per week;
 - Use of water for watering outside plants and turf areas using a hand-held hose without a positive shut-off valve.
- Use of water for decorative fountains or the filling or topping off of decorative lakes or ponds. Exceptions are made for those decorative fountains, lakes or ponds which utilize recycled water and are equipped with a recirculation system.
- Limiting the use of water for filling and refilling swimming pools.
- Service of water by any restaurant except upon the request of the patron.
- Use of water for purpose of irrigating landscape by means of permanently installed sprinklers for more than 15 minutes per station per day.
- Hotels must provide guests option to not launder towels and linen on a daily basis
- Use of water at any car wash that is not equipped with a recirculation system.
- Restaurants must use conservation nozzles.

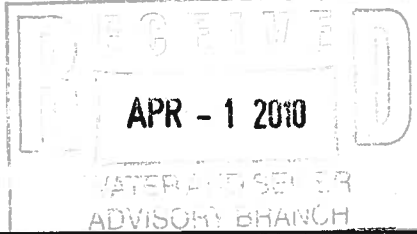
