Enclosed is a copy of the advice letter, with an effective date of December 7, 2010, for the utility's files.

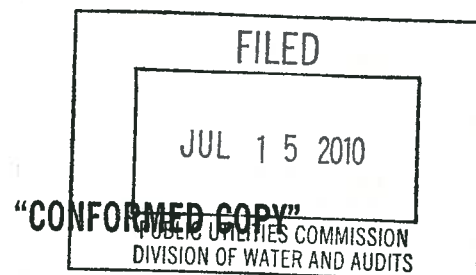

Advice Letter No. 1409-W

(U 133-W)

California Public Utilities Commission

Golden State Water Company ("GSWC") hereby transmits one original and three conformed copies of the advice letter applicable to its Water Operations.

Subject: Commence the implementation of a Research, Development and Demonstration ("RD&D") Program

Purpose

The purpose of Advice Letter 1409-W ("AL 1409") is to seek the California Public Utilities Commission's ("Commission") authority to do the following:

- (1) Commence the implementation of a Research, Development and Demonstration ("RD&D") program to design and construction of prototype, modern high technology Pressure Reducing equipment to reduce the kW loss or increase the efficiency by 50% by using the Operational Energy Efficiency Program to recover the kWh energy being lost in 2010; This program is also expected to provide precision control of flow and pressure for the water distribution system.
- (2) Expedited Commission approval such that the RD&D kW demand reduction and kWh electrical energy recovery projects can be commenced in 2010 to take advantage of available federal tax credits, and;
- (3) To track all reasonable construction and associated costs (the return of and return on such assets) to the Operational Energy Efficiency Memorandum Account previously authorized by the Commission in D.10-04-030.

AL 1409-W is being submitted pursuant to General Orders Nos. 96-B and in compliance with the Commission's Decision No. ("D") 08-11-057, issued November 24, 2008.

Background

In response to Commission decision D. 08-11-057, in which the Commission encouraged the water utilities to "identify opportunities for efficiency improvements", GSWC hereby request the Commission's authorization to commence a RD&D-OEEP PRV improvement program involving the recovery of electrical energy which is being wasted at the present time.

GSWC is requesting the Commission for authorization to participate in the development and construction building of prototype, modern, efficient and high technology pressure-reducing valves ("PRV") to recover as much as wasted electrical energy, and at the same time improving the pressure and flow of water in the system to much higher level of precision, compared to the present levels. Therefore, GSWC is proposing to construct two hydro-turbine-generator ("HTG") energy recovery projects.

1. A 48 KW installation at our CB-35 connection in Norwalk.
2. A 120 KW installation at our OC-55 connection in Cypress.

This RD&D project is a natural extension of the Operational Energy Efficiency Program ("OEEP"), which is a collaborative effort between the Commission, the investor-owned water utilities and the regulated energy utilities (Pacific Gas & Electric Company and Southern California Edison Company). The collaborators believe that saving energy through energy efficiency in the State of California is a core responsibility of every Californian.

The proposed project has many benefits, such as recovering enough energy on an annual basis to satisfy the daily demand of more than 54 homes for electricity, creating jobs and reducing atmospheric green house gases ("GHG") by 91 metric tons (MT) each year.

RD&D Project Description

GSWC purchases treated water from member agencies of the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California ("MWDSC", "MWD", or "MWDOC"). This wholesale water supply is delivered at high-pressure from MWDSC and must be depressurized by GSWC through pressure-regulator valves ("PRV") prior to entering GSWC's distribution system. MWDSC must maintain a high water pressure in order to supply other retail customers, located elsewhere in their system.

A PRV is a large valve that dissipates excess hydraulic energy across multiple orifices, creating noise and heat. Although generally inefficient, a PRV is necessary to prevent over-pressurizing water mains. Therefore, replacing a PRV with a HTG presents an ideal opportunity to recover otherwise wasted hydraulic energy and convert it into electricity. A HTG uses the excess hydraulic energy in the pipe to spin a turbine, which is directly coupled to a generator.

A significant amount of energy will be recoverable from the project proposed by GSWC. Additionally, RD&D projects of this type further the energy recovery knowledge of both water and energy utilities. Finally, these projects help the State of California and the energy utilities meet their renewable portfolio goal of generating power from green renewable sources.

As described previously, the HTG projects are a natural extension of the OEEP collaborative effort between the Commission, the investor-owned water utilities and the regulated energy utilities. OEEP has been successful in allowing GSWC and other water utilities to install computer hardware and software on booster and well pumps, enabling the pumps to operate at their optimal point of overall operational efficiency, thereby saving valuable energy resources. The proposed RD&D program will show whether the HTG projects have the potential to save even more energy than OEEP. Additionally, new rebates and tax incentives are now available for these kinds of projects.

The RD&D Program should be authorized by the Commission for the following reasons:

1. A new technology, "positive displacement pump as a turbine generator," was introduced in 2009. This new technologically advanced equipment simplifies construction and reduces project cost.
2. Section 1603 of the American Recovery & Reinvestment Act ("ARRA") of 2009 allows a thirty percent grant for HTG projects in 2010.
3. The Commission's Division of Water & Audits staff advocates development of HTG.
4. These projects conform to State policy objectives:
 - a. The Commission's Water Action Plan requires Class A water utilities to reduce their energy consumption by ten percent within three years
 - b. The Governor's Executive Order S-14-08 mandates that the energy utilities obtain thirty-three percent of their power from renewable energy sources by the year 2020.
 - c. State law AB32 requires that the level of green house gases in the atmosphere, primarily CO₂, be reduced to the same level measured in the year 1990, approximately a 30% reduction from today.
5. The HTG projects will create new engineering and construction jobs for California workers.
6. The projects will help GSWC reduce its overall energy consumption.
7. The annual energy generation from this "combustion-free" project, will reduce GHG in the atmosphere by 91 metric tons.
8. The project meets the objective of the CPUC's Water Action Plan, which calls for Class A regulated investor-owned water companies to reduce their energy consumption by 10% within three years
9. Complies with Governor Schwarzenegger's Executive Order S-14-08 to generate 33% of the electricity consumed in the state from renewable energy sources by the year 2020
10. Reduce GSWC's need to purchase electricity from SCE.
11. A hydro-turbine-generator is propelled by the excess pressure at imported water turnouts (pressure differential between Metropolitan Water District's pipelines and GSWC's distribution system)

12. Hydro-turbine generates electricity 24/7 feeding SCE's electrical grid
13. Delivers electrical energy directly into SCE's grid, without transmission loss, thereby improving their grid's efficiency and reliability during peak demand times
14. Green energy project, which reduces GSWC's carbon footprint
15. Renewable energy project, which release zero greenhouse gas into the atmosphere
16. Project qualifies for both an ARRA Section 1603 grant, equal to 30% of the project cost, and 6-year accelerated depreciation
17. Renewable energy reduces the United States of America's reliance on foreign oil and natural gas
18. Earns tradable renewable energy credits ("TREC")
19. Provides GSWC with greater operational flexibility and reliability
20. Leverages existing utility plant property
21. Helps offset the need for SCE to construct new peaking generators

Detailed RD&D Project Description

CB-35

CB-35 is an MWD connection in the City of Norwalk with a maximum capacity of 10 CFS. An 8" Pressure Reducing Valve ("PRV") reduces MWD pressure and controls flow. Both the meter and the PRV are located above ground on GSWC owned property. A Zeropex HTG will be installed in parallel with the existing PRV. Zeropex's HTG is an enhancement and miniaturization of the older hydropower technology. This new product was specifically designed for replacements of PRVs. It will be used for flows up to 3.8 CFS with the existing PRV handling flows above this level.

The Zeropex HTG is equipped with an electronic rate-of-flow controller, allowing GSWC to select the optimum flow rate to match demand conditions. Additionally, being a positive displacement device similar to an automobile service station gasoline pump, each revolution of the turbine elements discharges a fixed volume of water; therefore, the HTG also acts as a flow meter and is equipped with an integral flow rate transmitter.

Historical data, extracted from GSWC's records, are summarized below. These parameters were used as the basis for the conceptual design of the subject project.

- Average flow rate of 1.8 MGD with 210 feet differential head.
- Maximum monthly flow rate of 2.5 MGD with 210 feet differential head.

Using the power calculator, found on www.zeropex.com, GSWC and its consultant made a preliminary equipment selection. CB-35 would generate 310,000 kWh annually, using a 48 kW HTG.

CB-35 is located in close proximity to SCE's overhead electric lines. When operating, electric energy from the HTG will enter the neighborhood power grid and be distributed to residences. Transmission losses are negligible, since the turnout is centrally located

within the electrical power grid; this "distributed generation" is another benefit of the proposed projects.

GSWC estimates construction can be completed in approximately ten months after Commission approval of the projects. Permits must be obtained from the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC"), the Central Basin MWD, SCE and the City of Norwalk. GSWC's consultant advises that the FERC conduit exemption permit will be the longest lead time (six months) item; however, construction can proceed in parallel with FERC permitting.

OC-55

OC-55 is an MWD connection in the City of Cypress with a maximum capacity of 25 CFS. A 16" and an 8" PRV operating in parallel reduce MWD pressure and control flow. The PRVs are located above ground in a building on GSWC owned property. A Zeropex HTG will be installed in parallel with the existing PRVs. Zeropex's HTG is an enhancement and miniaturization of the older hydropower technology. This new product was specifically designed for replacements of PRVs. It will be used for flows up to 9.0 CFS with the existing 16" PRV handling flows above this level.

The Zeropex HTG is equipped with an electronic rate-of-flow controller, allowing GSWC to select the optimum flow rate to match demand conditions. Additionally, being a positive displacement device similar to an automobile service station gasoline pump, each revolution of the turbine elements discharges a fixed volume of water; therefore, the HTG also acts as a flow meter and is equipped with an integral flow rate transmitter.

Historical data, extracted from GSWC's records, are summarized below. These parameters were used as the basis for the conceptual design of the subject project.

- Average flow rate of 1.8 MGD with 240 feet differential head.
- Maximum monthly flow rate of 5.8 MGD with 240 feet differential head.

Using the power calculator, found on www.zeropex.com, GSWC and its consultant made a preliminary equipment selection. CB-35 would generate 200,000 kWh annually, using a 120 kW HTG.

OC-55 is located in close proximity to SCE's overhead electric lines. When operating, electric energy from the HTG will enter the neighborhood power grid and be distributed to residences. Transmission losses are negligible, since the turnout is centrally located within the electrical power grid; this "distributed generation" is another benefit of the proposed projects.

GSWC estimates construction can be completed in approximately ten months after Commission approval of the projects. Permits must be obtained from the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC"), the MWDOC, SCE and the City of Cypress. GSWC's

consultant advises that the FERC conduit exemption permit will be the longest lead time (six months) item; however, construction can proceed in parallel with FERC permitting.

Expedited Commission Approval

GSWC is requesting an expedited approval of AL 1409-W request such that the RD&D energy recovery projects can be commenced in 2010 to take advantage of available federal tax credits. To further the expeditious commencement of these projects, GSWC additionally proposes to track all reasonable construction and associated costs (the return of and return on such assets) to the Operational Energy Efficiency Memorandum Account previously authorized by the Commission in D.10-04-030 and approved in GSWC's Advice Letter 1399-WA.

Rate Impact

The authority requested in this advice letter does not have an immediate rate impact.

Tier Designation

Pursuant to D. 07-01-024, this advice letter is submitted with a Tier 3 designation. As such, a Commission resolution will be required for disposition.

Effective Date

GSWC is requesting that this filing become effective upon regular statutory notice.

Protest And Responses

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:


If you have not received a reply to your protest within 10 business days, contact this person at 909-394-3600.
