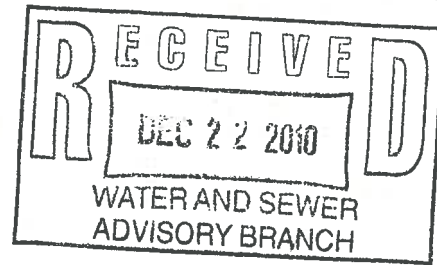

SUBJECT: *Revise the Preliminary Statement to include the Barstow Water Alert Memorandum Account*

PURPOSE

The purpose of this filing is to revise GSWC's Preliminary Statements to include the Barstow Water Alert Memorandum Account ("BWAMA"). GSWC needs to establish the BWAMA to track the incremental costs related to the Do Not Drink Water Alert (Water Alert) that GSWC issued in its Barstow customer service area on November 19, 2010.

BACKGROUND

On November 18, 2010, GSWC was notified by personnel at the United States Marine Corps ("USMC") Nebo Supply Base that samples taken from the base water distribution system showed levels of perchlorate above the maximum contaminant level ("MCL") of 6 parts per billion. GSWC immediately sampled water from the distribution system outside the base on November 18, 2010.

The test results from the samples collected on November 18, 2010, which were received by GSWC on November 19th, indicated the level of perchlorate was above the MCL. On November 19, 2010, GSWC issued a Water Alert in its Barstow customer service area.

GSWC also collected well samples and found three wells (only one of which was pumping to the system at the time) exceeded the MCL for perchlorate. The impacted wells were removed from service.

Perchlorate is an inorganic chemical often used in solid rocket propellant, fireworks, explosives, flares, matches, and a variety of industries. It usually gets into drinking water as a result of environmental contamination from historic aerospace or other industrial operations that used or use, store, or dispose of perchlorate and its salts. Because there can be adverse health issues with the consumption of water that contains levels of perchlorate above the MCL, GSWC Barstow customers were advised to not consume any ice, beverages, juice or formula prepared with tap water, until the water supply was declared safe to drink. GSWC made available and provided bottled water to its Barstow customer during the Water Alert.

CUSTOMER NOTIFICATION

GSWC informed its Barstow customers by 1) utilizing a "reverse 911" calling service to attempt telephone contact with each customer, 2) distributing printed customer notices door to door, and 3) issuing news releases to local television and radio stations, and 4) participating in live news conferences with City of Barstow officials on a local cable channel, and 5) by updating its website (www.gswater.com).

COMPLIANCE

On November 19, 2010, GSWC notified the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) of the Water Alert, as required. The Commission was updated on the progress of the water service restoration until the Water Alert was lifted.

On November 20, 2010, the Governor of the State of California declared a State of Emergency in the City of Barstow. As a result of the declared emergency, GSWC activated its CEMA for the Barstow Water Alert.

On November 24, 2010, the California Department of Public Health lifted the Do Not Drink Water Advisory for all of Barstow and GSWC customers were notified that the water supply was declared safe for consumption.

GSWC has approximately 8,900 service connections in Barstow and vicinity, serving an estimated population of approximately 40,000 people.

REQUEST

GSWC is seeking this memorandum account to track its incremental administrative expenses working with the customers and businesses that were impacted negatively and financially by the Water Alert, claims for reimbursements, costs to determine claim validity, and costs to employ legal and technical experts to investigate and remedy the contamination, customer credits, and bottled water costs. The costs that are being tracked in the BWAMA are those not covered in the CEMA.

EXPENSES

GSWC believes that it will incur costs that should be captured in the BWAMA. These costs are for the following:

- a) Claims (i.e. loss of business) from local businesses affected by the Water Alert.
- b) Meetings with stakeholders, such as the California Department of Public Health, area cities, and local elected officials.
- c) Legal and technical experts to investigate and remediate the contamination. Investigation costs include, but are not limited to, increased monitoring, site investigations, discharge compliance plans and actions, and related costs. Remediation costs may include engineering or technical expertise, consultant and/or legal fees and related expenses (including carrying costs for any needed capital improvements).
- d) Claims from residential or other customers affected by the Water Alert, including legal expertise.
- e) Increased customer communication costs and public outreach efforts.
- f) The costs of providing bottled water to customers during the Water Alert.
- g) The \$8.00 credit that GSWC is giving to all residential customers in Barstow for reimbursement of the water charges incurred in having to flush their water lines to remove any residual perchlorate after the Water Alert was lifted.

REQUEST TO ESTABLISH A MEMORANDUM ACCOUNT

In accordance with the Commission Standard Practice U-27-W, GSWC requests to establish a memorandum account to recover the aforementioned unanticipated costs.

These costs are of an exceptional nature for GSWC. GSWC believes it will incur costs to review claims from customers and local businesses that were impacted negatively and financially by the Water Alert and the declared State of Emergency in Barstow.

GSWC must expend all reasonable and necessary costs to protect its water supply and provide uninterrupted service to customers. The costs being addressed here are caused by an event of an exceptional nature that is not under the utility's control and the required expenditures were unforeseen and are not in the existing rates.

These costs could not have been reasonably foreseen in GSWC's last Region III General Rate Case ("GRC") and will occur prior to GSWC's next scheduled Region III GRC.

GSWC may jeopardize full recovery of the costs discussed above by waiting until its next scheduled GRC filing.

GSWC anticipates that it will incur substantial costs providing documents, employing expert legal and technical consultants, preparing for meetings and hearings and or settlements of claims from local businesses and customers impacted financially.

GSWC customers will benefit from the establishment of this memo account. Before recovery is granted, the expenses tracked in the memo account goes through a prudence review by the Division of Ratepayer Advocates and the Commission Division of Water and Audits to make sure the company did not spend money without discretion. Because of this clear benefit, GSWC's request meets U-27 W's fifth criterion.

MEMORANDUM ACCOUNT TREATMENT

GSWC is aware that a memorandum account is not a guarantee of eventual recovery of expenses, nor is it carried as a regular account under the uniform system of accounts for water utilities. It is carried "off the books" as a memorandum account. Further, it is also known that the California Public Utilities Commission policy on memorandum account treatment has always been that the burden of proof of the reasonableness of expenses charged to the account is the responsibility of the utility requesting reimbursement of such expenses.

TIER DESIGNATION

Pursuant to D. 07-01-024, this advice letter is submitted with a Tier 2 designation.

PROTEST AND RESPONSES

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding;

- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:


If you have not received a reply to your protest within 10 business days, contact this person at 909-394-3600 ext. 682.

The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

The actions requested in this advice letter are not now the subject of any formal filings with the California Public Utilities Commission, including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.

QQ. BARSTOW WATER ALERT MEMORANDUM ACCOUNT

(N)

Purpose

The purpose of the Barstow Water Alert Memorandum Account (BWAMA) is to track unanticipated incremental administrative expenses related to the Do Not Drink Water Alert that GSWC issued in its Barstow Customer Service Area on November 19, 2010.

The BWAMA shall include:

All incremental administrative expenses working with the customers and businesses that were impacted negatively and financially by the Water Alert, claims for reimbursements, costs to determine claim validity, and costs to employ legal and technical experts to investigate and remedy the contamination, customer credits, and bottled water costs.

GSWC shall maintain the BWAMA by making entries at the end of each month as follows:

- a. A debit entry shall be made to the BWAMA at the end of each month to record the expenses.
- b. A debit entry equal to interest on the balance in the account at the beginning of the month and half the balance after the above entry (a.), at a rate equal to one-twelfth of the rate on three month Commercial Paper, as reported in the Federal Reserve Statistical Release, H.15 or its successor.

The BWAMA shall go into effect on the effective date of Advice Letter 1426-W.

Disposition of amounts recorded in the BWAMA shall be determined in a regulatory proceeding authorized by the Commission.

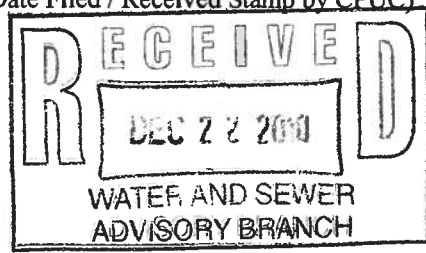
