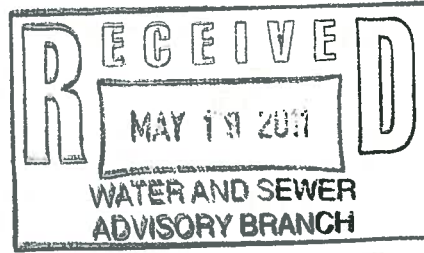

SUBJECT

Supplement to Advice Letter 1439-W, Schedule No. R3-1 – R. This supplemental filing is being made to correct a typo in Schedule No. R3-1-R to include the correct rate for 1”meter fire with a domestic need of 3/4” meter as approved by Advice Letter 1437-WB.

Summary

This advice letter requests amortization of the cumulative balance of \$10,217,818 or 8.61% recorded in net of the Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (“WRAM”) balancing account and the Modified Cost Balancing Account (“MCBA”), for the period of January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010 for GSWC’s Region III Customer Service Areas. This request is made pursuant to Decision D.08-08-030 authorizing the Settlement Agreement between the Division of Ratepayer Advocate (“DRA”) and Golden State Water Company (“GSWC”) on WRAM & Conservation Rate Design Settlement (“Settlement”). The authorized Settlement Section IX.C.4 :

- 4. If this report shows that the combined over- or under-collection for the WRAM or the MCBA in any ratemaking area exceeds 2.5% of the ratemaking area’s total recorded revenue requirement for the prior calendar year, GSWC will file an advice letter within 30 days that amortizes the balance in both of the accounts in the district.*

Background

On August 25, 2008, the Commission issued Decision D.08-08-030 authorizing the settlement agreements between GSWC and DRA on WRAM and Conservation Rate Design issues pursuant to Ordering Paragraph 1 from D.08-08-030:

The following settlement agreements are approved and adopted:

- Golden State Water Company (GSWC)/Division of Ratepayer Advocates (DRA) on conservation rate design trial program and amendment to settlement except the interim rate design for Region I.*

The authorized Settlement section IX outlines the recovery and refund of the WRAM and MCBA balancing accounts. Section IX (RECOVERY AND REFUND OF BALANCING ACCOUNTS) of the Settlement document states:

- C. *The Parties agree that, in each ratemaking area, the balance in the WRAM will offset the balances in the MCBA in the following manner:*
1. *Reporting Requirements: By March 31st of each year, GSWC will provide the Water Division (with a copy to DRA) with a written report on the status of the WRAMs and MCBA as described herein.*
 2. *WRAM: The written report will include a section on the WRAM in each ratemaking area showing the revenue over- or under-collection with respect to actual (or recorded) water sales as of December 31st of the preceding calendar year. Differences between Actual Revenues and Adopted Revenues will be tracked in the WRAM and accrue interest at the 90-day commercial paper rate.*
 3. *MCBA: The written report will include a section on the MCBA in each ratemaking area comparing Actual MCBA Costs with Adopted MCBA Costs as of December 31st of preceding calendar year. Differences between Actual Costs and Adopted Costs will be tracked in the MCBA and accrue interest at the 90day commercial paper rate.*
 4. *If this report shows that the combined over- or under-collection for the WRAM or the MCBA in any ratemaking area exceeds 2.5% of the ratemaking area's total recorded revenue requirement for the prior calendar year, GSWC will file an advice letter within 30 days that amortizes the balance in both of the accounts in the district.*
 5. *The WRAM and MCBA for each ratemaking area will always be considered together for the purposes of seeking recovery or providing refunds to ratepayers and will be netted prior to any refund or recovery.*
 6. *If the 2.5% threshold is not met, this balancing account will be amortized in the next GRC.*
- D. *Surcharges and surcredits: Recovery of under-collections and refunds of over-collections will be passed on to rate payers through volumetric surcharges and surcredits.*

Report on WRAM and MCBA Balances

GSWC filed an information-only report with the Division of Water and Audit (“DWA”) on March 2, 2011 showing the following WRAM and MCBA balances for Region III:

The report further detailed the adopted and actual balances for revenues and production costs, as well as the interest earned on the difference between the adopted and the actual revenue. This information is reported for Region III for the period of January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010.

The purpose and method of tracking WRAM and MCBA is outlined in the Settlement Section V (MECHANISMS FOR DECOUPLING SALES AND REVENUE):

- A. *The goals of the decoupling mechanisms in the Pilot Program are as follows:*
 1. *Sever the relationship between sales and revenue to remove any disincentive for GSWC to implement conservation rates and Conservation programs.*
 2. *Ensure cost savings resulting from conservation are passed on to ratepayers*
 3. *Reduce overall water consumption by GSWC ratepayers.*

- B. *Decoupling of GSWC will be accomplished through both the following mechanisms:*
 1. *A Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (WRAM) for each ratemaking area.*
 2. *A Modified Cost Balancing Account (MCBA) for each ratemaking area. MCBAs will replace existing cost balancing accounts for purchased power purchased water, and pump tax.*
 3. *In Accordance with established Commission practice, the WRAM and MCBA accounts will accrue interest at the 90-day commercial paper rate.*

GSWC’s WRAM and MCBA were tracked in accordance to the Settlement. The Region III balance amount for the period of January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010 is an under-collection

of \$10,217,818 or 8.61% which exceeds the 2.5% threshold set forth in the Settlement document (IX.C.4) for the balance account recovery.

The Settlement section VI.B states:

- B. The WRAM will track the differences between Adopted Revenue and Actual Revenue, excluding;*
- 4. Fire service revenue;*
 - 5. Unmetered Service revenue*
 - 6. Other non-general metered service revenue*

Therefore, non-general¹ metered water services are excluded from the allocation of the net WRAM balance.

Per the Settlement section VII.C, the activation of MCBA will replace current supply cost balancing accounts. Section VII.C of the settlement states:

- C. An MCBA will replace each of the current balancing accounts, now referred to as Supply Cost Balancing Accounts:*
- 1. GSWC currently has a Supply cost Balancing Account for purchased water, purchased power, and pump taxes.*
 - 2. The Supply cost Balancing Account tracks cost changes attributable to changes in unit price, but not changes in the amount of consumption.*
 - 3. MCBA's track changes in price and quantity.*

GSWC filed Advice Letter #1272-W on March 12, 2008 requesting amortization of its Region III Supply Cost Balancing Account for the amount of \$7,021,356 to be recovered over a 24-month period effective May 28, 2008. The surcharged expired May 27, 2010 and has a remaining residual of \$1,128,910 still uncollected. The under-collection of \$1,128,910 is included in the MCBA to be collected in this current filing.

The net MCBA balance is allocated to all Region III metered customers with the exception of the frozen districts², Mallon well, Pomona College, Forest Lawn and Claremont Limited Irrigation (R3-CMP-3M). These areas will not receive any surcharges or surcredits from this filing.

Pursuant to Standard Practice U-27-W, the net WRAM and MCBA under-collection of 8.61% is to be recovered over a 2 year or 24-month period. The Standard Practice U-27-W section G.56.b states:

Reserve and memo account amortization surcharges shall be spread over one year for undercollections of less than 5% of gross revenues, over two years for undercollections of 5% to 10% of gross revenues and over three years for undercollections over 10% of gross revenues. Recovery shall be tracked in a balancing account.

Request

The purpose of this filing is to increase the water rates in Region III by \$10,217,818 or 8.61% to amortize the cumulative balance recorded in the net of the Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (“WRAM”) Balancing Account and the Modified Cost Balancing Account (“MCBA”), for the period of January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010. GSWC is seeking to implement a temporary surcharge of \$0.183 per Ccf for residential metered customer on Schedule No. R3-1-R, \$0.162 per Ccf for non-residential customer on Schedule No. R3-1-NR and a surcredit of \$0.066 per Ccf for non-general metered Schedule No. R3-CM-7ML, R3-CMH-3M, R3-SD-3, R3-OC-3M, and Calipatria Prison to recover the under-collection of net WRAM and MCBA balancing accounts in Region III. The temporary surcharge would be in effect for a 24-month period beginning on the effective date of Advice Letter 1439-W.

Any over or under-collection resulting from this surcharge will be included in subsequent filings for recovery of the WRAM/MCBA.

Rate Impact

The monthly bill of a residential customer on Schedule No. R3-1-R with a 5/8” x 3/4” meter using 17 Ccf would increase during the 24-month amortization period by \$3.11 or 5.00% from \$62.20 to \$65.31.

The monthly bill of a non-residential customer on Schedule No. R3-1-NR with a 5/8” x 3/4” meter using 85 Ccf would increase during the 24-month amortization period by \$13.77 or 5.91% from \$233.02 to \$246.79.

Tier designation

Pursuant to D. 07-01-024, this advice letter is submitted with a Tier 1 designation.

Effective date

GSWC is requesting that this filing become effective March 8, 2011.

Protest And Responses

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;

- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:

If you have not received a reply to your protest within 10 business days, contact this person at 909-394-3600.

Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division, within the 20 day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

The actions requested in this advice letter are not now the subject of any formal filings with the California Public Utilities Commission, including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.

No individuals or utilities have requested notification of filing of tariffs. Distribution of this advice letter is being made to the attached service list in accordance with General Order No. 96-B. GSWC will notify its customers of this rate increase by placing a message on the first water bill after the increase is granted.

As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$0.162 per Ccf is to be added to the Quantity Rate (N) for a period of 24 months, beginning on the effective date of Advice Letter 1439-W. This surcharge will apply to all customers (N) covered by the WRAM in 2010 that were billed at the metered rate from January 1 through December 31, 2010, with the (N) exception of Morongo Valley and Wrightwood customers. 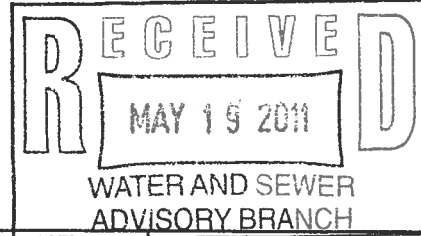
